PROGRAMME SCHEDULE

- 0830h** **Registration**
- 0900h** **Opening remarks** and discussion on significance of personal and professional development.
- 0930h** **Food for Thought**
Rendition of story, "The Boy Who Climbed the Mountain" checking in on first impressions of story.
- 1030h** **Tea break**
- 1100h** **Analysis and reflection** on the ten stages of personal development Facilitator's deliberation on the 10 stages – Genesis, Inspiration, Aspiration, Germination, Transformation, Guide, Cultivation, Reflection, Harvest and Renewal. Parallels/illustrations in the story.
