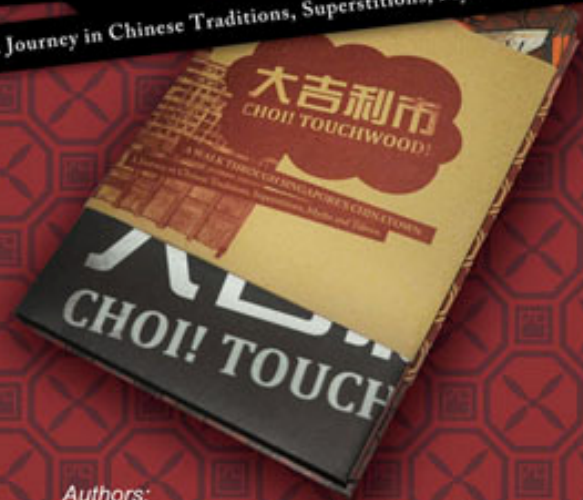


大吉利市 CHOI! TOUCHWOOD!

Jesvin Yeo is an assistant professor in the School of Art, Design and Media at Nanyang Technology University. As a researcher, Jesvin main research areas are on Asian material culture, visual research and knowledge visualization. Her work focused on the details of design and putting a message in context, particularly in book design and taking typography into 3D and digital form. Jesvin has presented and published her works at several international conferences and also exhibited her creative works internationally, including renowned 798 Art District in Beijing, Museum of Design in Atlanta, Museum of Contemporary Art in Washington, etc.

Liew Jie Ni is a designer in The Brand Union. She entered the branding and design industry after graduating with a Bachelor of Fine Arts from School of Arts, Design and Media at Nanyang Technological University. Aside from her passion in branding and exhibition design, she is recognized for her strength in illustrations, idea conceptualization and visualization.

Alvin Ng is a multidisciplinary designer based in Singapore. His recent work included designing a worldwide booth design guide for Urban Redevelopment Authority (URA), 2010-2013, and the booth graphic for World City Summit Singapore. Alvin is the creative director for Youth Olympic Games Bid book, as well as involving in the design of the booth interior for Youth Olympic Games village 2010. An expertise in branding communications and print media, his work included a wide range of packaging design for renowned international brand Santa Barbara Polo & Racquet Club and Senses International.
